ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Between

Arkansas State University-Jonesboro and Arkansas State University - Newport

PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to assist students holding an Associate of Science degree in Criminal Justice from Arkansas State University - Newport (ASUN) to transfer smoothly from ASU-Newport to Arkansas State University – Jonesboro (ASUJ). Through this effort, the partners hope to increase graduation rates, facilitate the transfer process, and promote the system emphasis of collaboration between/among the ASU system campuses.

AGREEMENT

Satisfactory completion of an Associate of Science degree in Criminal Justice from ASUN will be accepted as satisfying the general education core requirements of Arkansas State University-Jonesboro. This agreement does not address specific degree requirements outside of the General Education component, such as major or minor courses. Students should select those courses based on the specific degree requirements of ASU-Jonesboro. An ASUN student who holds an Associate of Science degree in Criminal Justice with a 2.0 cumulative grade point average will be accepted for transfer subject to the following conditions:

1. The Associate of Science degree in Criminal Justice will include the following:

Minimum Required Hours (60)

- 2. Remedial course grades will not be computed in the cumulative grade point average for purposes of admission to Arkansas State University-Jonesboro.
- 3. Any course with the grade of "D" which was earned as part of the Associate of Arts degree (emphasis in criminal Justice) at Arkansas State University Newport will transfer for credit to Arkansas State University-Jonesboro. However, specific degree requirements may require a grade of "C" or higher in certain courses.
- 4. Degree and program requirements subsequent to the AA degree (emphasis in Criminal Justice) for students who transfer under this agreement will be determined in the same manner as if their initial enrollment had been at Arkansas State University-Jonesboro.
- 5. Arkansas State University-Jonesboro will provide ASU-Newport with copies of catalogs/curricular requirements as they are published.
- 6. Arkansas State University Newport will provide Arkansas State University-Jonesboro with current copies of catalogs/curricular requirements as they are published (although most such documentation has/will become web-based at www.astate.edu).
- 7. Calculation of overall GPA for purposes of graduation and awarding of honors is left to the discretion of Arkansas State University-Jonesboro.
- 8. Information regarding transfer scholarships will be made available to students while attending ASU-Newport.
