

### **Disability Services**

At ASU-Newport, we believe every student has the right to achieve their highest ability academically, socially and intellectually. Although ASUN does not offer a specialized curriculum for persons with disabilities or assume the role of a rehabilitation center, we offer a variety of support services so that students with disabilities are admitted and integrated as completely as possible into the university.

Reasonable accommodations are provided on an individual basis and are determined from the student's documentation and interview with the Office of Disability Services. To obtain reasonable accommodations, students must provide documentation of diagnosed disability to the Disability Services Coordinator. It is to your advantage to contact the Disability Services Coordinator before enrolling in courses at ASU-Newport.

#### Academic Challenge Scholarship - High School - Non-Traditional Students

The Academic Challenge Program provides scholarships to Arkansas residents pursuing a higher education. Funded in large part by the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery, the Academic Challenge Scholarship is available to students regardless of their academic status, whether just graduating from high school, currently enrolled in college, enrolling in college for the first time, or re-enrolling after a period of time out of college.

For High School seniors, the only requirement is a 19 on the ACT or ACT equivalent score (990 on SAT), FAFSA Required.

### Step 7: Keep Financial Aid

Federal regulations require all recipients of student financial aid to make Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) towards an eligible degree or certificate program. Students applying for assistance through the Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Federal Work Study, Direct Subsidized Loan, Direct Unsubsidized Loan, Direct Parent PLUS Loan and other programs as determined by the Financial Aid Office must meet the requirements in the policies listed below to maintain their financial aid eligibility at ASU-Newport, including the Jonesboro and Marked Tree sites. Being financially eligible according to results from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) does not mean the student is eligible for federal aid at ASUN. Rules are applied uniformly to all students whether or not aid has been previously received.

The Financial Aid Office (FAO) monitors SAP at the end of each semester, including summer, for financial aid recipients. In reviewing SAP, FAO personnel evaluate GPA, completion rate and maximum timeframe. At the conclusion of each semester, students who do not meet the minimum SAP requirements are notified and either placed on Financial Aid warning (FA Warning) or Financial Aid Suspension (FA Suspension). Please note: students on FA Warning have one semester to meet SAP eligibility or will be placed on FA Suspension the next semester.

- Students placed on FA Warning are eligible for financial aid consideration and do not need to appeal, but will be required to sign an academic plan.
- Students placed on FA Suspension are no longer eligible for financial aid and may submit a SAP
  appeal to be considered for financial aid for one semester.

Student tuition and fees are due in full at the time of registration. It is the responsibility of the student to verify, prior to the first day of classes, that sufficient aid is in place to cover tuition and fee charges for the semester. Payment arrangements should be made prior to the beginning of the semester, if sufficient financial aid has not been awarded to the student's account.

Payments can be made by phone by calling (870) 512-7802, or in-person via the cashier at any of our campus locations.

For students that do not have financial aid in place and are unable to pay the full amount of tuition and fees before classes begin, we offer an online payment plan through <u>FACTS</u>.

Cash-paying students enrolled in the Commercial Driver Training Institute (CDTI) program will be required to pay the cost in full upon registration of the program. Payments are made by phone by calling 870-512-7802, or in person at the cashier window on the Newport campus. CDTI students who are sponsored by a third party will have their account credited for payment when the billing processes are complete and the paying entity makes payment for the sponsored student.

### **NelNet Monthly Payment Plan**

Paying for the rising costs of a college education is a concern for nearly every student and their family. The fact is, few of us have the resources to simply write a check for the full cost of tuition each semester. Having a solid plan for covering the cost of college is an important step toward graduation.

Arkansas State University-Newport is pleased to enlist the services of NelNet to make the process easier for you. NelNet is a convenient budget plan, not a loan program. You have no debt, there are no interest or finance charges assessed and there is no credit check. The cost to budget your interest-free monthly payment plan is a \$25.00 per semester (or \$45 annual) non-refundable NelNet enrollment fee or a \$2.00 enrollment fee for immediate full payments.

#### **Payment Options**

#### Automatic Bank Payment (ACH)

ACH payments are those payments you have authorized NelNet to process directly with your financial institution. It is simply a bank-to-bank transfer of funds that you have pre approved for your expenses at ASUN. Payments may be made from either your checking or savings account. Payments are processed on the 5th of each month and will continue until the balance is paid in full.

#### **Credit Card Option**

Paying with your credit card gives you the option of taking advantage of any bonus programs that may be offered by your credit card company. Your monthly payment will be automatically charged to the credit card you designate. Payments will be charged on the 5th of each month until the balance is paid in full.

#### **Down and Full Payment Options**

Down or full payments are deducted immediately from the account provided on the agreement. If the payment fails for any reason, the agreement is terminated and notification is sent to the person responsible for payment. A \$2.00 non-refundable NelNet enrollment fee will be assessed



### **Career Pathways**

#### Overview

Career Pathways is a grant-funded program designed to assist low-income parents complete an educational degree and enter a high paying, high demand career field. Possible benefits for eligible students may include tuition and fees, textbooks, child care and fuel assistance to and from class.

#### In order to qualify you must:

#### 1. Be a resident of Arkansas, and

2. Have custody of at least one child under the age of 21 years who lives in the home on a permanent basis, **and** 

3. Have earned at or below 250% of the federal poverty level. (\$60,750 for a family of four – 2016 level)

If you said YES to all three, then you need to contact Career Pathways!



### **ASU System Policy**

Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Subject: Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

#### 1. Purpose

Arkansas State University will comply with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

2. Definitions

Arkansas State University. Arkansas State University (ASU) means all the campuses within the Arkansas State University System, now and in the future.

Student. Student means an individual who attends or has attended classes at ASU. This policy does not apply to the records of applicants for admission who are not accepted to ASU nor does it apply to applicants who are accepted but choose not to attend ASU.

Education Record. Education records are those records, files, documents, and other materials which contain information directly related to a student and are maintained by ASU or a person acting for ASU.

**Directory Information.** Directory Information is designated to be the student's name; local and permanent physical addresses; electronic mail addresses; telephone listings; photographs and electronic images; date and place of birth; major field of study; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; weight and height of members of athletic teams; dates of attendance; degrees and awards received; and the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student.

#### 3. Arkansas State University Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Policy

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act requires that institutions of higher education strictly protect the privacy rights of all students who are or who have been in attendance. Information contained in the student's education records can be shared only with those persons or entities specified within the Act. The law also provides that students have the right to review their education records

ASUN shall not tolerate harassment in relation to the evaluation of employee or student performance, nor shall the University tolerate such behavior in the context of collegial and/or co-worker interaction. Such conduct is an abuse of authority and position. ASUN maintains as its official policy that sexual harassment of either employees or students will not be tolerated. The University shall act promptly to investigate all allegations of sexual harassment and to effect appropriate remedy when an allegation is determined to be valid.

Sexual harassment is defined as unwelcome sexual advances, request for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when:

1. Submission to or toleration of such conduct on or off campus is made a term or condition of instruction, employment or participation in other university active ties.

2. Submission to, or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as a basis for evaluation in making employment or academic decisions affecting the individual; or

3. Such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's academic or employment performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive University environment.

Supervisors and faculty members must recognize that their positions necessarily embody unequal power relationships with their subordinates and students, respectively. Because of the inherent power difference in these relationships, the potential exists for the less powerful to perceive a coercive element in suggestions relative to activities outside those appropriate to the professional relationship. It is the responsibility of supervisors and faculty members to behave in such a manner that their words or actions cannot reasonably be perceived as coercive.

All members of the university community are urged to report incidents of sexual harassment to the Department of Human Resources.
