*Students in pursuance of a **Bachelor of Science** in **Psychology** from A-State should take <u>PSY2013 Introduction to Psychology</u> as a social science elective and <u>PHIL1103 Introduction to Philosophy</u> as a directed elective.

Students in pursuance of a **Bachelor of Science in Social Work** from A-State should use one of the Advisor Approved courses to take <u>SW2203 Introduction to Social Work</u> and <u>SOC2213 Principles of Sociology</u> as a social science elective and the following as general education/directed electives; SOC2223 Social Problems PSY2013 Introduction to Psychology PSY2533 Lifespan Development
