

# ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Between

Arkansas State University- Jonesboro  
and  
Arkansas State University- Newport

## PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to assist students holding an Associate of Science degree in Natural Science from Arkansas State University- Newport (ASUN) to transfer smoothly from ASUN to Arkansas State University- Jonesboro (ASUJ). Through this effort, the partners hope to increase graduation rates, facilitate the transfer process, and promote the emphasis of collaboration between and among the ASU System campuses.

## AGREEMENT

Satisfactory completion of an Associate of Science degree in Natural Science from ASUN will be accepted as satisfying the general education core requirements of ASUJ. This agreement does not address specific degree requirements outside of the General Education component, such as major or minor courses. Students should select those courses based on the specific degree requirements of ASUJ. A student who holds an Associate of Science degree in Natural Science from ASUN with a 2.0 cumulative grade point average will be accepted for transfer subject to the following conditions:




3. Remedial course grades will not be computed in the cumulative grade point average for purposes of admission to ASUJ.
4. Any course with the grade of "D" which was earned as part of the Associate of Science degree in Natural Science at ASUN will transfer for credit to ASUJ. However, specific degree requirements may require a grade of "C" or higher in certain courses.
5. Degree and program requirements subsequent to the ASUN Associate of Science degree in Natural Science for students who transfer under this agreement will be determined in the same manner as if their initial enrollment had been at ASUJ.
6. ASUJ will provide ASUN with copies of catalogs/curricular requirements as they are published.
7. ASUN will provide ASUJ with current copies of catalogs/curricular requirements as they are published. These will be available via the campus website at [www.asun.edu](http://www.asun.edu).
8. Calculation of overall GPA for purposes of graduation and awarding of honors is left to the discretion of ASUJ.
9. Information regarding transfer scholarships will be made available to students while attending ASUN.

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
